

#### Meet One of Our Favorite Members, Harriet Bemus

A long time bowler, Harriet and her husband, Bill, became active NHLBC members in 1991. Bill served as president in 1995. Harriet is now a social bowler, joining us on Saturday mornings, Thursday evenings and ladies day bowling after her water aerobics class.

Born and raised in England, her father was a wool merchant, her mother an American who had studied art in Paris. Before the war, Harriet became a home economist. In 1942, she was among the first group of women to serve in the British army. She rose to the level of captain. In 1948, she came to the U.S., first to New England, then to California where she worked as a house cleaner in Laguna Beach then later as a home economist at the Edison Co. She married Bill, a second generation Californian. They had 3 children and she is the grandmother of 16 and great grandmother of 6.

Following a several years working with the Orange County Victim's Witness Program, Harriet now serves on the Public Law Center Board. She also serves on the Newport Beach Art Museum Council. She is an avid world traveler; she has an upcoming cruise from Brazil to Barcelona and recently visited Cuba.

Harriet, you're a good friend, a good bowler and a terrific role model.

#### Got cans, plastic and glass bottles?

#### Recycle

You can make a difference. Vanis Buckholz does. He is an 11 year old boy who lives in Corona del Mar and he will pick up whatever we can recycle- glass bottles, plastic bottles, aluminum cans. We have put recycling containers dedicated to these three items, one near the front door and the other outside the kitchen door.

Vanis has been recycling other people's garbage since he was 7 years old. As he says "it is a dirty job but someone has to do it." He was inspired by a school project when he collected recyclables for a week for Earth day. But what happens next. Vanis decided to continue and the job has been so successful that he has set up a business called My ReCycler. He collects from the Oasis center, the Corona del Mar Post Office, other community centers, friends and neighbors.

He picks up what he can from around the neighborhood with his bike and a cart. His father, Dave, collects any large amounts in his truck. Vanis sorts it and they take it to the recycling depot in Santa Ana once every 2 weeks. Last year, Vanis collected 55,000 pounds of recyclables.

He donates 25% of his profits to the charity, Project Hope Alliance, which helps to settle homeless families in Orange County. Do you know that there are 28,000 homeless children living in Orange County? Vanis donated enough last year to settle one family in a home. He received a Point of Light award from President Bush for this charity work. Vanis looks like an 11 year old boy should but make no mistake, he takes his job seriously. We should too. He will be coming every Thursday to pick up the recyclables we collect.
